The FEMA shelters were built to protect the community of Monett whenever there is a severe storm approaching.

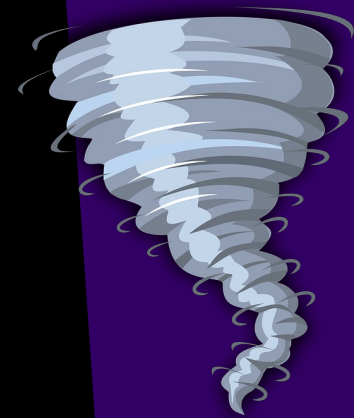

- The FEMA shelters are made out of rebar, metal, steel and 12-inch concrete.

How safe is it?

- It can handle and EF-5 tornado.

When do the doors open?

- The doors will always open automatically when the sirens go off.

What communications equipment is located in the FEMA shelters?

- One NOAA Weather Receiver (battery powered + power continually recharged)
- One AM-FM radio (wind-up/battery powered)

Do you go to storm spotter classes?

- For your safety it is recommended to go to storm spotter classes.
- By going to storm spotter classes, you will learn what to do in a situation of a severe weather storm and how to prepare yourself.



Are you prepared at home?

Here are some very important things you might want to consider taking with you when you take shelter: first aid kit, canned food, water, flashlights, and a safe room.
